As a national of the European Union (EU) or Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein or Switzerland, you have the right to work in any other member state. You do not need a work permit. The EU provides common rules to protect your social security rights when moving within Europe.

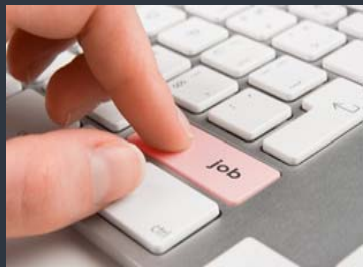
