The Eurovision Song Contest 2010

Yes, it's that time of year again... And if you already follow us on twitter and Facebook you will know that we are getting ready to celebrate!!!

2010 sees the 55th installment of the Eurovision Song Contest - with 39 countries participating, two semi-finals (25 and 27 May) and a grand final on 29 May. This year's competition, with the theme "Share The Moment", will take place in Oslo, Norway, after Alexander Rybak won last year's competition.

Eurovision is one of the longest-running television programmes in the world. In 2003 the Junior Eurovision Contest was born, and in 2007 the Eurovision Dance Contest followed. The Eurovision website states: "The competition has been broadcast throughout Europe, but also in Australia, Canada, Egypt, Hong Kong, India, Jordan, Korea, New Zealand and the United States, even though these countries do not participate. In 2010, the format will be launched outside of Europe so that various other parts of the world will be introduced to the concept behind the show."

As you know Norway is not part of the European Union but is part of the European Economic Area (EEA). And this is one of the great things about Eurovision: it unites Europe, European Union and non-European Union countries, citizens from across the continent!



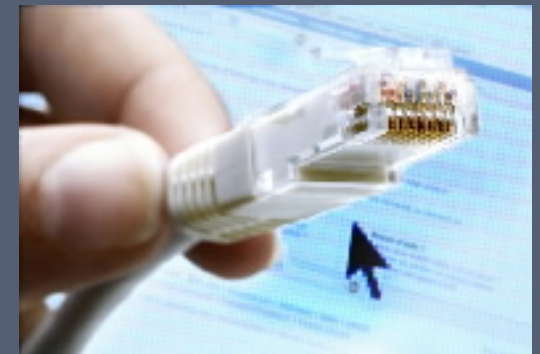
